## Hydraulic Monitor Unveiling Event at Kentucky Camp By Mark Doumas

In our previous Kentucky Camp Chronicle, we featured the recently donated hydraulic monitor (water nozzle) used to mine for gold at nearby Boston Gulch.

In the intervening months, we have developed a plan for permanently displaying the monitor at Kentucky Camp and we are well on our way to completing this key addition to the site.

The Coronado National Forest (with the support of Friends of Kentucky Camp) invites you to see the unveiling of this historic hydraulic monitor.

The event will take place at Kentucky Camp, a turnof-the-century restored mining and ranching site in the Santa Rita Mountains north of Sonoita. The public is invited to attend on Saturday, November 10, 2012, between 10:00 AM and 3:00 PM. The event is free.

In addition to the unveiling, activities will include site tours and a **speci**al walking tour to nearby Boston Gulch where portions of the historic water system and hydraulic workings are still visible. The tours highlight the need for water in order to get the gold. Friends of Kentucky Camp fundraising merchandise will also be available for sale.

Please come enjoy the beautiful Santa Rita Mountains and experience its rich cultural history.

Kentucky Camp is a "natural" destination for adventure cycling because the Arizona Trail runs through the site.




